Classify the following verbs (italicized parts) as raising vs control:

Meg <i>is likely</i> to come to class.	Meg <i>is certain</i> to come to class.	Meg <i>is believed</i> to be leaving.
Meg <i>decided</i> to come to class.	Meg <i>tends</i> to come to class.	Meg <i>threatened</i> to leave.
Meg <i>arranged</i> to be in prize.	Meg <i>attempted</i> to leave.	Meg <i>refuses</i> to leave.
Meg <i>expects</i> to win a prize.	Meg <i>requested</i> to leave.	Meg <i>is eager</i> to leave.
Meg <i>is starting</i> to leave.	Meg <i>promised</i> to leave.	Meg <i>is sorry</i> to be leaving.
Meg <i>is lucky</i> to win a prize.	Meg <i>is unlikely</i> to win a prize.	Meg <i>appears</i> to be leaving.
